Melvin Roads Post 1231 has been a valuable fixture in the

been a valuable fixture in the East Greenbush Community for seventy-five years. We now need your help to keep it strong and vibrant for another seventy-five. As the Post membership grew—particularly after WWII—so did the building we maintain on Columbia Turnpike. Activities in the banquet hall, lounge, and our weekly bingo provided sufficient revenue to keep the building in good order and support the Veterans community

for many years. But recently that activity has not been able to keep up with expenses. For the past three years the post has lost money, largely due to a combination of reduced activity in the banquet hall and the lounge along with ever rising costs for utilities, insurance, and general maintenance.

Over the past several months the post officers and board of directors, along with the Auxiliary, Sons, and Riders have made a number of changes that have addressed our financial viability considerably. For example, we have aggressively marketed and increased the number of events in the hall and added a full time chef to provide food offerings for any number of occasions.

We have added weekly attractions such as Country Line Dancing, an ongoing Pub Poker Tournament, Pool and Dart Leagues—all having a very positive affect on our bottom line. (cont'd page 2)

75th Anniversary

Did you know that 2015 is the 75th anniversary of Melvin Roads Post? On May 23rd, 1940, we were designated a permanently chartered unit. The formal presentation was made on that date in the presence of Mr. and Mrs. Orange Roads, the parents of Melvin Roads who was killed in action in France the day before the Armistice. Adjutant Ernest Heyman presented the charter to our first Commander Benjamin Pearsall. The American flag which originally was placed on the grave of their son in France was given to the post by Mr. and Mrs. Roads. Our hero's body now lies in Greenbush Cemetery, off Hayes Road. Plans are under way to look at how to celebrate our 75th.

At the same time we continue to support the community by making space available for events like Red Cross Blood Drives and Veterans Job Fairs. We are now covering our operating expenses. Unfortunately, that is not enough. In order to keep the building up to date and efficient to operate we need to make some major renovations and improvements and we need your help to do that.

Over the next three years we hope to upgrade our meeting rooms, remodel the banquet hall, replace outdated heating and air conditioning equipment, and remodel the lounge to make it more competitive. We have already replaced the carpeting in the lounge with tile and added flat screen TVs over the bar area - two improvements that have been well received. As we consider these proposals, we would also like to hear from you about any improvements you think we should make.

The Post has initiated a Capital Campaign with a goal of raising \$100,000 over the next three years - and we're asking all of our Melvin Roads family - both members and the community - to help however one can.

In the next few weeks in the mail, you will be receiving further information about this campaign along with avenues you can use to positively respond. As our Post is a 501(c)19 non profit, your contribution is tax deductible. Please give thoughtful consideration to this campaign.

Post Hosts Veteran Staats Family

On March 6th, the Staats family of Schodack held a family get-together at Melvin Roads Post. The Post was honored to host the family and guests for this very special occasion. Grant S. Staats enlisted as a sailor in 1977. From there he completed Basic SEAL training and was assigned to SEAL Team One. Grant took time out from his active military career to teach at the college level. In 1992 he was given a direct commission and has served in Kuwait, Quatar, Iraq, Germany and Uganda.

But this gathering wasn't about Grant. His son, Evan Staats, began basic training in the Navy's Great Lakes program on March 24th. He has applied for and has been awarded a Navy SEAL contract.

Veterans School Tax Exemption Approved

At their monthly meeting, January 28th, the East Greenbush School Board adopted the alternative veterans exemption for 2015 school taxes at the maximum levels of \$6,000 wartime, \$4,000 combat zone, and \$20,000 disability. The Board also adopted resolutions to include Gold Star Parents and relocation of an exemptee (within the same town) as also eligible. It is our understanding that the assessors office should be transferring existing veterans exemptions for the town to school taxes.
