Given that fact, I think we need to address something that affects us as veterans in the political arena. I'm not talking about any specific political persuasion, I'm speaking of those that don't do the right thing when it comes to veterans, military personnel and their families. A good example of what I'm talking about is the issue surrounding the Blue Water Navy vets who served on hundreds of vessels off the coast of Vietnam. By doing so they—just like those “in-country”—were exposed to Agent Orange through the drinking water supplies which came from Vietnam. Bill H.R.

3612, The Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act of 2011, would allow blue water veterans who served up to 12 miles off-shore in Vietnam presumptive coverage for Agent Orange exposure. This would enable them to receive Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits if they have suffered from any of the diseases the U.S. government has linked to Agent Orange. This legislation is about 10 years overdue and if it were not for the American Legion and Vietnam Veterans of America it would never have been brought forward.

Let's face it we have to look out for each other which means getting veterans the services they need and deserve. So we need to follow this legislation and inform our representatives

"I found these two veterans seeking out a living doing auto motive work on a dirt road. No car left but they did want to work and earn a living. They both have physical problems and injuries. They find it hard to get regular work with the big guys.

I thought this was a good time to cheer some one up for

'Christmas.' I thought it would be a good time for my part to do something for them so I donned my Melvin Roads Post uniform and [bought each a gift] and pizza pie. I told them their gifts were from Melvin Roads Post #1231 New York. They were surprised and very happy to receive the attention and presents. 'Troy Hicks said [I] never thought anything like this would happen to them.' He said thank the post for thinking of them. I said I would. The three of us in

the picture represent WW 2, Korea and Vietnam. When I looked at their faces I knew we did the right thing at the right time..
