75th Anniversary Celebration of Melvin Roads Post

On Saturday, September 26th, the Melvin Roads Post Family will formally acknowledge its 75th Anniversary! On May 23rd, 1940, this Post was designated a permanently chartered American Legion unit. And it has been going strong ever since!

The day's program begins at 12Noon with a picnic atmosphere: hot dogs and hamburgers from the grill, chips, soda, beer along with games, prizes and 50/50's during the afternoon. And there will be a dunk tank! At 6pm a Chicken dinner will be served to all. There will be a DJ from 1 to 5pm and entertainment will be offered in the lounge that evening.

All activities will take place on the Post grounds.

The cost per person will be \$25/member, \$30/non-member payable in the Post lounge until September 20th. Those planning to attend are asked to register at this email address created for the event: melvinroads75th@yahoo.com. You may also register simply by calling the Post at 462-7006.

On May 23rd, 1940, Adjutant Ernest Heyman presented the charter to our first Commander. Benjamin Pearsall, in the presence of Mr. and Mrs. Orange Roads, the parents of Melvin Roads who was killed in action in France the day before the Armistice was signed in 1918. Our post is named in honor of this World War I hero.

Boys' State Delegates Report Back

"Caring for veterans after they come home!" That was one of the issues raised by the members of Boys' State 2015 as they gathered to discuss issues of importance, learning the ins and outs of governing," so said Stephen Reilly, one of two out that "All the guys were broken down into 10 counties [or platoons, as the marines called them] of 100 delegates. There was a counselor for each county, one for each of the three cities in each county, and a junior counselor for the entire county; the junior counselors were all recent



delegates sponsored by Melvin Roads Post. David Sills, the other delegate of MR, said he was impressed by the thoughts presented by the many speakers from various roles of government in New York State. He said he gained a much better view of how government actually works.

Stephen and David met with us shortly after their trip to Boys' State to share their initial reactions of the experience. "No cell phones, no news [they knew nothing of the Dannemora crisis], just marching and drilling in the rain from one event to another!" David said he felt at times like they were living in a world of 200 years ago! But that's one of the benefits of Boys' State. Quality time without distractions kept the 1,100 young men focused on their mission. David pointed Boys' State alumni themselves. Each county had a Sergeant from the Marines who guided them through PT and the daily drilling."

Asked what they have taken away from this experience, Stephen, who plans to apply for the Naval Academy, felt that discipline and integrity were among the qualities that impressed him the most. David, who is travelling to Germany this summer, felt that the ability to adapt, to have an open mind were values he felt made an impression on him.

And how about the marines!? "Lots of push-ups... in the rain! It didn't matter," reported David. But he also was very impressed with a Staff Sgt. Kyne. As a member of the Marine Corps Band, he was present to assist the Boys' State marching band. David had brought his clarinet to play in the Boys' State Band and said that Staff Sgt. Kyne was very informative and most interesting explaining how the marine band works. "Team effort, and the value of knowing we were 'all in this together", was something that the Marines instilled in the delegates, so reported Stephen Reilly.

Both young men were more than appreciative of the experience, and as a token of their gratitude, presented Melvin Roads Post with a new American flag and POW flag. And they look forward to coming to a Post meeting in the fall to personally thank the membership for sponsoring them at Boys' State 2015. We look forward to that!
